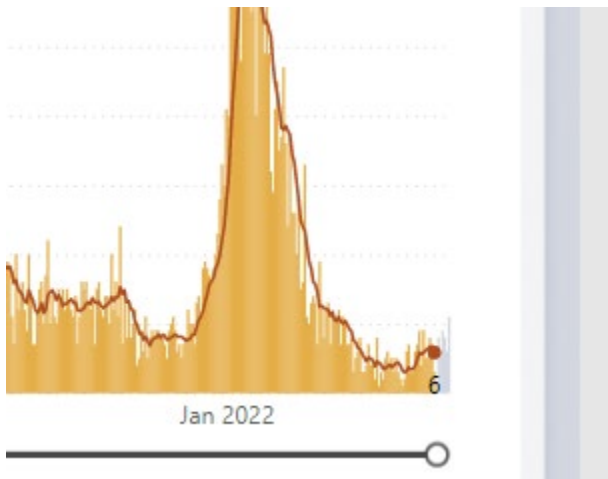
Chief Nursing Officer

Mason Health presented to students in the Health Science Academy on Friday 4/22. Lindsay (lab supervisor), Kelly North, and myself presented on our Future Healthcare workers of Mason County program. Application packets were handed out to those interested in the program. Phlebotomy tech, MA, and RN roles were discussed. I can give a verbal summary at the board meeting. The applications are due by April 29th. The ‘interview committee’ will be conducting interviews with candidates the week of May 2nd.

The new RT director, Kristy Christopher will start on May 1st. We will also begin doing Pulmonary Function Tests beginning in May. We are providing refresher training to the therapists who perform the procedure. We had to delay all PFT’s due to the pandemic back in 2020.

We have had two covid positive staff who made full recoveries over the past two weeks. Covid numbers in our community continue to be small. King County is seeing some increase in numbers of hospitalized Covid cases the past two weeks. Our service contract has ended on the temperature kiosks. Kim Cooper has researched screening requirements (CMS, DOH) and we are no longer required to take temperatures of visitors/patients and employees. We made the decision to sunset the kiosks since the service contract have ended.

Hospital census has been high the past week with no real pattern. Low 20's-30 for census. Morale is stable.
