Vaccinations

Who is eligible for a COVID vaccine?

- All Washingtonians ages 5 years and older are eligible to receive a COVID-19 vaccination.
- Vaccinations are offered at the vaccine clinic (*Red Square* on map below) (for those 12 and older) or with your primary care or pediatric provider at Mason Clinic.
- Parental consent/permission and completed consent forms will be required prior to vaccination.

Who can receive a COVID booster?

• Everyone ages 12 years and older may get a booster COVID-19 vaccine if they choose.

When to get a booster:

- At least 5 months after completing your primary COVID-19 vaccination series if you received Pfizer or Moderna shot.
- At least 2 months after your Johnson & Johnson shot.
- If you are a child, 5-11, who is immunocompromised, you can receive a third dose of Pfizer 1 month after your second dose.

Testing

Shallow, nasal COVID testing is available at the Curative kiosk at Mason Health (Red circle on map).

- Appointments may be limited due to high demand and severe weather conditions.
- Testing is available by walk-up or appointment. Test results are delivered electronically within 24-48 hours.

If you are seen at Mason Clinic or Hoodsport Primary Care, please allow for us to plan properly for your appointment by answering our screening questions when you check in.

The clinical team will prepare and wear protective gear based on whether you have COVID-related symptoms.

No Visitors Allowed – All Patients (Limited Exceptions for Special Circumstances) Cafeteria Open to Authorized Visitors Only

All patients and visitors must wear a mask provided by Mason Health. Upon entry a mask will be provided for you.

The following safety measures continue to be in place:
