The award was named after Ben Lindekugel, the late Association of Washington Public Hospital Districts executive director who was dedicated to ensuring good governance among hospitals across the state.

Hilburn has served as an elected commissioner for the District for 18 years.

"Scott represents the very best in hospital governance: a passion for his community, commitment of his time and attention, and a dedication to finding solutions to challenging problems," said Cassie Sauer, WSHA president and CEO.

Hilburn has also served as mayor of Shelton and has been active in the Noon Kiwanis Club, the Mason County Intergovernmental Council, the Shelton-Mason County Chamber of Commerce, which honored him as a Citizen of the Year, and the Economic Development Council of Mason County.

Hilburn co-founded the Karen Hilburn Cancer Fund with his wife, Karen, in 2004, to financially support Mason County women for treatment of breast and cervical cancers.

"It truly feels like a new day for Mason General," he said. "When we accomplish something really special, it's because we have a team of leaders all working together to achieve a common goal. I am thankful to our CEO Eric Moll, my fellow commissioners, Gayle Weston and Don Wilson, and to Karen, my wife, who supports my mission to make our Hospital the very best it can be."
