# MGH&FC departmental moves make way for new Medical Office Building

Ground breaking for the new Medical Office Building is expected this summer, as work on a series of enabling office moves has already begun. The medical office building will be located directly east of the Hospital on the existing campus, and some offices had to be relocated to accommodate the staging of construction. These moves will impact Human Resources, Health Information Management, Volunteer Services and Development/Foundation offices. The temporary office relocations are being coordinated closely with staff and providers to keep any disruptions to a minimum. As construction plans continue to unfold, the following MGH&FC departments will be moved before the end of the summer.

- By July 10, the **Development and MGH Foundation** office will be relocated to suite 170 at the Gateway Center, across the street from its current location.
- By July 16, **Health Information Management** (Medical Records) will be moved from its location at Mason General Hospital to Gateway Center. Its new address will be 2505 Olympic Highway North, Suite 410, Shelton.
- By August 16, **Human Resources** (HR) and **Volunteer Services** will be moved into the space HIM/Medical Records occupied on the lower level of Mason General Hospital at 901 Mountain View Drive, Shelton.
- By August 30, the current **Business Office** located at suite 450 in Gateway Center will be remodeled to bring together the **Accounting and Finance** departments.


