What is a Podiatrist?

According to the American Podiatric Medical Association, a podiatrist, also called a doctor of podiatric medicine, is a specialist who provides medical diagnoses and treatment of foot and ankle problems such as bunions, heel pain, spurs, hammer toes, neuromas, ingrown toenails, warts, corns, and calluses. A podiatrist also renders care of sprains, fractures, infections, and injuries of the foot, ankle, and heel.

In addition to undergraduate medical school training, podiatrists also attend graduate school for a doctorate degree in podiatry. Podiatrists are required to take state and national exams, and must be licensed by the state in which they practice.

Podiatrists are in demand more than ever today because of a large aging population. In addition, according to the Association, foot disorders are among the most widespread and neglected health problems affecting people in this country.
